This policy explains the process and procedures for receiving, evaluating, developing and implementing student requests for disability-related accommodations.¹

Lincoln Technical Institute/Lincoln College of Technology/Euphoria Institute of Beauty Arts & Sciences ("Lincoln") Lincoln Educational Services (Lincoln) is committed to providing opportunities for all qualified students with disabilities to participate in its programs, activities and services including students with disabilities who need accommodations. A qualified student is one who meets the essential academic and technical standards requisite to admission or participation in our programs, activities and services.

Accommodations under the ADA include admissions and recruitment, treatment of students, academic adjustments (e.g., course examinations, auxiliary aids, and/or services), financial assistance to students, and nonacademic services.

The Education Department Leader is responsible for (1) explaining to applicants and students how to obtain information about the available academic adjustments, and auxiliary aids and/or services, and (2) receiving requests for accommodations.

All requests for accommodations must be submitted to the Education Department Leader. While a student may discuss a possible accommodation with the Education Department Leader, the Education Department Leader is the only person authorized to grant or deny accommodations.
