- x Don't take shortcuts through dark or poorly lit areas
- x Do not carry or flash large amounts of cash
- x Walk or jog in groups of three or more; do not wear earphones while walking or jogging.

- x Do not broadcast when you are going home or out of town except to your most trusted friends.
- x Be aware of crimes on and around campus.
- x Know the Fire/Emergency Exits of your surroundings: cafeteria, classroom and workspace.
- x Stay alert, and plan ahead for "What if..."
- x Educate yourself about the Linc Alert System and opt in. It is the primary means of notifying you in case of an emergency. This includes notifying you of school closings due to inclement weather.

Student Disciplinary Procedures

Lincoln Technical Institute will, upon written request, disclose to the alleged victim of a crime of violence, or a non-forcible sex offense, the results of any disciplinary hearing conducted by the Institute against the student who is the alleged perpetrator of the crime or offense. If the alleged victim is deceased as a result of the crime or offense, Lincoln Technical Institute will provide the results of the disciplinary hearing to the victim’s next of kin, if so requested.

Individuals who are found to have violated any of the Student Code of Conduct or any of the following policies will be disciplined by Lincoln Technical Institute in accordance with the severity of the incident. Sanctions may include suspension from classes or expulsion from the Institute. For employees, disciplinary action may include suspension with or without compensation, or termination of employment.

Stalking

Stalking is a course of conduct directed at a specific person that would cause a reasonable person to fear for his or her safety or the safety of others; or suffer substantial emotional distress. A “reasonable person” under the definition of stalking means a reasonable person under similar circumstances. Acts of stalking may include acts in which the stalker, either directly, indirectly, or through a third party, follows, monitors, observes, threatens, communicates to or about a person, or
